

Advancement Placement® Guidance and Results

AP classes begin in the 9th grade, and students can take an unlimited number of these classes. All students who take an AP class are required to take the exam, and Saint James students consistently score above both the global and state averages for those courses offered. In May 2024, exam scores in 84% percent of classes offered met or exceeded the state and/or global average.
